In these current times of unprecedented upheaval, where are we to place our focus? If we look around us, the world seems to be in crisis at almost every level. Perhaps you and I need to fix our gaze elsewhere.

When Enemies Gather

In these uncertain days, I have turned often to one of my favorite passages: 2 Chronicles 20. In this chapter of the Bible, an amazing story unfolds regarding the children of Israel under Jehoshaphat's leadership.

At the beginning of the chapter, the King of Judah receives notification that the armies of three countries are mustering against his little nation. We can all understand how this information might strike fear in his heart. Even so, Jehoshaphat set all of Judah to corporate fasting to seek the Lord together.

Then, he himself stepped forward to lead his subjects in prayer—first declaring God's power and might, then recounting the many acts of divine faithfulness. Next came his reminder to God of what He Himself had directed His people to do: in times of disaster and crisis, they were to come to His holy temple and cry out to Him for help.

The Cry and the Response

Jehoshaphat's discourse ends with these words from verse 12: "For we have no power against this great multitude that is coming against us; nor do we

know what to do, *but our eyes are upon You.*"

Their determination to gaze at the One who had promised to deliver them from disaster resulted in an outpouring of prophetic encouragement and direction.

They heard words like, "Do not be afraid or dismayed because of this great multitude, for the battle is not yours, but God's." They heard, "You will not need to fight in this battle", followed by specific prophetic instruction as to what action they should take.

In the end, a looming disaster turned into a dramatic deliverance.

Our Focus in Hard Times

Where are we to turn our eyes when everything in the world seems to be aligning itself against us? We gaze upon the One who alone is able to help us, rescue us, and deliver us—by His power, not ours.

A New Testament counterpart to what Jehoshaphat modeled in this story is Hebrews 12:2, which in the New American Standard version begins with these words: "fixing our eyes." The original Greek translation of that phrase means this: "to turn the eyes away from other things and fix them on something."

In desperate times, we intentionally turn our eyes from everything that might cause us to shrink back in fear. Instead, we look confidently at the One who can help us, and we focus solely on Him.

A Time for Aliyah

How do all these examples about fixing our gaze on the Lord relate to the role and necessity of Aliyah in these turbulent times?

One fact is undeniable from world history. National crises tend to place our Jewish brothers and sisters in heightened peril. Enemies of God's chosen people tend to coalesce in such times to target them specifically and increasingly.

A cry like that of Jehoshaphat could understandably go up from his modern-day brothers and sisters: "For we have no power against this great multitude that is coming against us; nor do we know what to do, but our eyes are upon You."

With eyes fixed on the One who is able to prevail by His great might, let us trust Him to open the way, fight the battle, and accomplish a great deliverance.

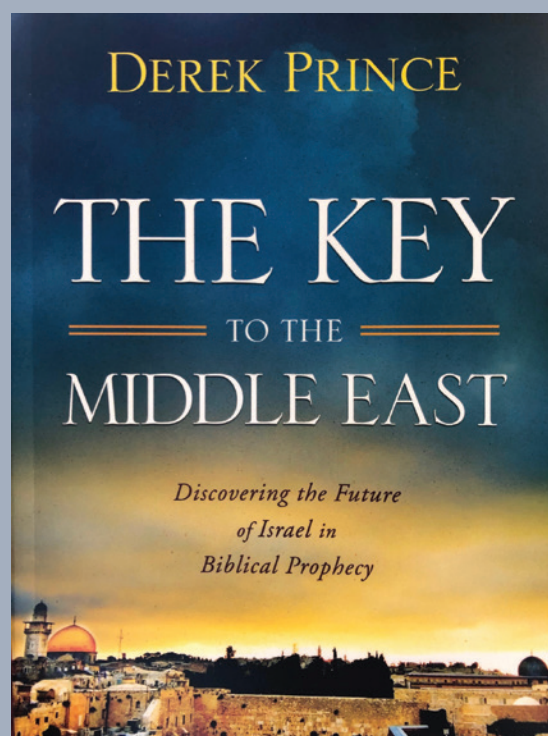

The Restoration of All Things

Therefore say to them, 'Thus says the Lord of hosts, "Return to Me," declares the Lord of hosts, "that I may return to you," says the Lord of hosts.' Zechariah 1:3 NAS

The homecoming—the return of God's people to their God-given Land—is a perpetual yearning on the Father's heart. From the time they were exiled and scattered, God has desired to capture their hearts and return them home. Zechariah was used by God to warn the people of his time. Through a series of visions and messages, God spoke of His wrath against sin, and judgement for the nations oppressing His people. He also revealed His fierce jealousy for Jerusalem and Zion, and a future restoration.

Today, these warnings and judgements resonate loud and clear as to the condition of the heart of Jews and Gentiles. Rebellion against God is manifesting the decay and destruction in almost every facet of our society. It magnifies our desperate need to return to God by walking in His holiness, righteousness and the truth of His Word. We are in a battle, but our God, the Lord of hosts, has already given us the victory through the obedience of our Messiah, Jesus, the Savior of Israel and the world.

The LORD is using these unprecedented times of peril to warn His people to return home. Aliyah is a stepping stone for God's people to know Him as their God. So far this year, as of mid-October

we have had the honor of assisting over 400 Olim (immigrants to Israel) make Aliyah, and we have hundreds more going through the process of returning home. Each Olim is a testimony of God's faithfulness to rebuild and restore Israel.

Shayan is a special young man we have had the privilege of assisting. Here are his photo and testimony (in part):

*"There's no place where I feel more spiritually connected, more emotionally pure and driven. There's no place like home. I make it my mission to encourage every Jewish person I know to actualize the dream of making Aliyah, returning to Israel to write the next chapter together in the story of our people....I cannot wait to return to the place where my heart, body and soul belongs and to make a home of my own in Eretz Yisrael. The Jewish people have never been more alive and well. **Am Yisrael Chai!**" (The people of Israel are alive!)*

Let us rejoice and celebrate Shayan's homecoming. Great is the Holy One of Israel!

We don't know what is ahead of us, but there is One who does! He is the Lord of hosts and our hope, and our trust is focused in Him and Him alone. He has made all provision for the days ahead.

NOTHING TOO DIFFICULT — ALL THINGS POSSIBLE

“Behold, I am the LORD, the God of all flesh; is anything too difficult for Me?”
Jeremiah 32:27 NASB

The Bible records numerous instances of God’s power to perform His promises in seemingly impossible situations that were often tumultuous and treacherous. The history of His actions throughout the past two thousand years bears witness that the God of the Bible remains the same.

Jeremiah had been prophesying the Babylonian exile and downfall of Jerusalem. Suddenly he had an opportunity to purchase property in the area, and the LORD instructed him to do so. What? Why? How could this be? Jeremiah’s response is recorded in Jer. 32:16-25. His prayer was an outpouring of praise, a recap of recent prophecies, a statement of the current siege taking place, and an expression of perplexity over buying property in the face of what was happening. God’s detailed answer began with the provocative question, “Is anything too difficult for Me?”

And looking at them Jesus said to them, “With people this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.”
Matt 19:26 NASB

The disciples were flabbergasted! Jesus had just shattered their traditional theology; being rich was considered a sign of God’s favor (see the context of Jesus’ statement). As end-time events

unfold, will any of our religious beliefs cause us to be astounded? At such a time, we can trust that the Spirit of Jesus will address our humanistic/limited/ignorant thinking by an explosion of the Truth in our hearts: “With God all things are possible.”

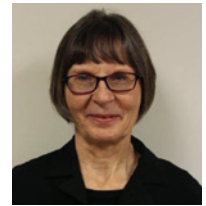
