Endurance

otal dependence on the Lord is the spiritual requirement for every active servant of God. Jesus said, "I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing." (John 15:5 NKJV) This applies in our individual lives and in outreaches raised up by the Lord. To have total dependence on the Lord to do anything spiritual requires every child of God to die to the natural man's plans and purposes, and to surrender to the Master's will.

In the worldwide body of Christ today, many servants of God have lost their sense of purpose. The Lord is drawing His people closer to Himself to separate our hearts from worldly things. The challenge is to be willing to patiently endure the

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testing of our hearts by circumstances and trials of our faith toward God. (To endure means to hold up under pain and fatigue, to carry on despite hardships – to suffer.) It is now time to humble ourselves before the Lord for Him to complete the circumcision of our hearts.

Moses was called – alone – to come before the Lord. Moses alone received the words of God for the release of His people Israel – his personal assignment from the Lord: "Come now, therefore, and I will send you to Pharaoh that you may bring My people, the children of Israel, out of Egypt." (Exodus 3:10 NKJV) Moses was going to have to learn endurance through the hardships that lay ahead, which would ultimately result in bringing God's people to the Promised Land – a holy calling (then, as today).

For man, this assignment was impossible. But the Lord encouraged Moses that He would be with him against all odds in fulfilling His purpose for the children of Israel. Twice the Lord tested him – once with the rod that became a serpent and turned back into a rod after he grasped it by the tail, as God told him to – then having his leprous hand restored (Exodus 4:2-7). He then had confidence to trust that the Lord was sending him to lead the children of Israel out of Egypt. If Moses was obedient and continued with faith towards God, the Lord would enable and empower him for the task.

Small Steps of Obedience

ometimes we do not recognize where small steps of obedience to the voice of the Lord are leading us. In the early '70s, my wife and I obeyed the voice of the Lord to work with Youth With A Mission (YWAM) after its president, Loren Cunningham, had shared in our church that YWAM was purchasing a ship




that would go from port to port around the world with volunteers to share the gospel. In obedience, we put our house up for sale and trusted Him to provide for our needs.

Over ninety people from the U.S., Canada, and Western Europe volunteered to travel on the ship, which we were to embark upon in Japan. En route, we stopped in South Korea to minister. On the last night of our time there, a very solemn Loren Cunningham told our group that early in the morning he had a vision of the ship and Christian supporters from around the world shouting in praise to God. But out of the corner of his eye, he saw Jesus weeping. Loren asked the Lord why He was weeping. He answered, "The eyes of My people are on the ship and not on Me." Continuing on, the Lord said that many of those who had volunteered were unclean. This shocked all of us, who had given up everything to do this work. We had been unaware of what was inside of us, as well as our need to depend totally on the Holy Spirit to change us.

As we arrived in Japan, the teachings were focused on heart preparation: "Lord, show me my heart as you see it." and "I repent from dead works." For five days our group cried out to the Lord in repentance for the things He revealed to

REPENTANCE: THE WAY TO EXCELLENCE

God says, "Rebuild the road! Clear away the rocks and stones so my people can return from captivity.

Isa 57:14, NLT

any boulders on the *Aliyah* highway have been placed there by organized efforts of the enemy, such as Freemasonry, Islam, Communism, and others. Anti-Semitism is unique in that the LORD uses it to compel His people to return home; but it is a boulder in that it causes the people called to carry His people home to not obey that command.

As a ministry we have removed many external boulders, and by God's grace we will continue. But the internal rocks and stones in our hearts can be subtle. If these are not removed from our hearts, we will not be able to fully accomplish the command to build up "The Holy Highway." (Isa 35:8, TLB)

We are all in the process of "working out our salvation with fear and trembling" (Phil 2:12, NASB). In modern lingo "we are a work in progress." Purposely presenting our hearts to the Holy Spirit for daily examination is essential for us to participate in the holy work of Aliyah.

"The high and lofty one who lives in eternity, the Holy One says this:

"I live in the high and holy place with those whose spirits are contrite and humble. I restore the crushed spirit of the humble and revive the courage of those with repentant hearts." Isa 57:15, NLT

Our God is the Holy One who dwells in a realm so far above our fallen world and finite minds that it defies measurement. His thoughts are high above ours (Isa 55:8-9; Isa 40:13; Rom 11:34).

Amazing Grace! Even so, He delights to dwell with "those whose spirits are contrite and humble." His Spirit searches His heart and our heart – restoring and reviving us – bringing us together in deep communion with Him (1Cor 2:10-11). God does not compromise His thoughts and ways to adjust to our fallen nature. Rather, through an indescribable work of Grace, our inmost fallen thoughts are permanently removed like rocks cleared from a road and replaced with His holy thoughts – a smooth path of obedience.

As we stay on the repentance path, our capacity to receive, digest and adopt His thoughts and ways increases. Our effectiveness to serve Him and His people on "The Holy Highway" of Aliyah is made more excellent day by day.
